

# See Something, Say Something



Know the signs of terrorism and how to report them to the authorities. These signs can include:

- Expressed or implied threats to people, a facility, infrastructure, or a secured site.
- Prolonged surveillance or unusual interest in a facility or building that goes beyond casual or professional interest. Someone taking pictures or videos of security measures such as camera placements, security checkpoints, or little-used access points are things to pay attention to.
- Someone eliciting information from personnel about the building, event, or operations that goes beyond mere curiosity.
- Materials acquisition and storage, including things like cell phones, radio controllers, or toxic materials that could be used to outfit an attack.
- The collection of an unusual number of weapons, including explosives, chemicals, or other destructive materials.

If you see something concerning, what next? DHS recommends that you keep the [Five Ws](#) in mind when making a report.

- Who or what you saw.
- When you saw it.
- Where you saw it.
- Why it was suspicious.
